


# BAPTISM AND COMMUNION

## Seeing It in the Bible

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19–20)

Happens once. Age doesn't matter. Although we are baptized once, every baptism helps us remember our own.



Marks us as God's children — members of the covenant and the household of God.


